STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL & REFUND POLICY

In the event a student elects to withdraw from attendance, that student will have rights to a full refund if cancellation is initiated formally as follows:

To cancel the course and be eligible for a refund, a student must submit in writing their notice to cancel through attendance of the first class session, or the seventh (7th) day after enrollment, whichever is later. If the cancellation is mailed in rather than hand-delivered, the letter must be submitted to 3355 Myrtle Ave Ste 200, North Highlands, CA, 95660, and the postmark must be prior to the first day of class, or the seventh (7th) day after enrollment, whichever is later.

Should a student withdrawal from the course and be eligible for a refund, the refund will be paid to the student, department, or agency that paid the course fees. In the event that a student withdrawal prior to the completion of 60 percent of the course, refunds will be dispersed on a pro rata basis. STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL & REFUND POLICY

In the event a student elects to withdraw from attendance, that student will have rights to a full refund if cancellation is initiated formally as follows:

To cancel the course and be eligible for a refund, a student must submit in writing their notice to cancel through attendance of the first class session, or the seventh (7th) day after enrollment, whichever is later.
